The Parish Plan

The Parish Council work to achieve what is desirable by parishioners. This is decided by a survey carried out every 10 years. There are 4,547 voters in Sitlington and 100 completed surveys were returned in 2020.

The Parish Council have been working on objectives raised by residents that will involve outside agents such as Wakefield Council and Arriva.

The Parish Council have been liaising with Wakefield Council on several matters including highway concerns such as speeding on Old Road and the need for a 20 plenty scheme to be in place around Middlestown Academy. Also safety on Blacker Lane and Sandy Lane together with speeding throughout the parish in general with a focus on the use of HGVs down Netherton Lane and New Road.

Meetings with Highways have been productive and allowed the Parish Council to raise these concerns on behalf of the residents.


The Parish Council are aware of the situation regarding the bus service throughout the parish. Prior to COVID a meeting was arranged and promising proposals outlined. However, since COVID the service has become disappointing. The Parish Council have worked closely with District Councillors and a further meeting is to be arranged to discuss the concerns of residents aiming to achieve a working relationship to improve services.

The Parish Council purchased 4 defibrillators initially and have continued to add further defibrillators so that one piece of equipment is within 3 minutes of every resident.

Other work the Parish Council have carried out is the re-surfacing of the toddler area at Netherton Playground together with the replacement of the basket swing for older children.
