<u>Report</u>

Patrols

PCSO 438 Kuritzin reports:

31/01/18 between 2300 and 0100 (Not included on last report)

High visibility patrols of Middlestown and Netherton. All areas of note checked at various times. A vehicle was PNC checked that was parked with occupants inside in the car park of Netherton Community Centre. Other than that there was nothing else to note and no calls for service.

PC 6487 Steel reports:

06/02/18 between 1230 x 1530

Patrols made between 12:30 X 15:30. Initially dealing with previous incident on OEL. Male responsible for nuisance riding in area was interviewed and issued an endorsable fixed penalty (£100 fine and 3 points on licence). General patrols of area with no issues. Report of an abandoned/suspicious car on fields within area. Vehicle located but transpired to be linked to nearby builders. Also came across two youths messing about near road causing a few traffic issues. Both moved on and no further problems.

Local schools patrolled with no problems regarding parking.

PCSO 438 Kuritzin reports:

10/02/18 between 2300 and 0100

High visibility patrols of Middlestown and Netherton. All areas of note checked at various times. Two vehicles were moved on from the Netherton Community Centre car park. Other than that there was nothing else to note and no calls for service.

PC 2534 Richardson reports:

26/02/18 between 2000 x 2200

High visibility traffic patrol around Netherton, concentrating on Upper Road/Stocksmoor Road. 4 x Verbal warnings for 34-35mph.

3 x Traffic Offence Reports for speeds between 41-44mph, all parties claiming thought it was a 40mph.

Even though very little traffic not many were adhering to the limit.



Crime

Middlestown

There were five reported crimes in Middlestown. Of these two were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The first of these was a burglary residential on Butts Lane were suspect/s have gained entry to an address through an insecure door and stolen car keys to a Ford C-Max. The vehicle was later found burnt out in Huddersfield. All lines of enquiry have been completed and no suspects have been identified.

The last of these was a theft of motor vehicle from Cross Road where a J reg Nissan Micra was stolen without keys. At this time the vehicle has not been located and the crime has been filed.

The other crimes consisted of damages at Water Lane and Butts Lane and an assault on Thornhill Road.

Midgley

There were three reported crimes in Midgley. Of these none were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The other crimes consisted of a damage on Stocksmoor Road and two assaults at Denby Grange School.

Netherton

There were four reported crimes in Netherton. Of these none were classed as serious acquisitive crimes.

The other crimes consisted of two vehicle interferences on Blacker Lane, a theft (other) on Coxley Crescent and a harassment at Highfield Road.

Overton

There were four reported crimes in Overton. Of these two were classed as serious acquisitive crimes. The first of these was an attempt burglary residential on Woodhall Close where the suspect/s have attacked the lock on a rear door but failed to gain entry. The enquiries are still ongoing into this and the next offence....

...which was at a neighbouring address on Woodhall Close where the suspect/s have again attacked the lock but managed to gain entry. Once inside they have stolen keys to two vehicles and then

stolen the vehicles. Suspects from Bradford have been identified and arrested. The investigation is still ongoing.

The other crimes consisted of a malicious communication on Crossfield Court and a theft (other) on Old Road.
