Report

Patrols

PC 2534 Richardson (Safer Scheme)

15/06/2018 Tour 12:00 x 14:00

Upper Lane, Netherton Lane. No Speed issues and also observed Blacker Lane for HGVs, no breaches during my presence.

Old Road, covered from 12:10-12:45, very little traffic between these times. No offences.

New Road, 2 x Traffic Offence Reports for excess Speed. 39mph and 47mph, 2 verbal warnings, speed 35mph and MOT. at location spoken to by member of public enforcing the need for officers on Old Road, did explain had patrolled he was stating that the timings are around 17:00hrs.

Officers PC2811 Verheyan and PC2650 Long observed Blacker Lane between the hours of 1700 and 1900 on Thursday 14th June in an attempt to identify any potential offending vehicles with regards the weight restrictions. During those hours, no vehicles were seen to be in contravention of the weight restrictions imposed.

<u>Crime</u>

Middlestown

There were eight reported crimes in Middlestown. One of these was classed as a serious acquisitive crime. This relates to a residential burglary on Ashwood Heights where the house was entered and two cars stolen with keys, there are no suspects at this time.

There was a gate damaged on Sandy Lane and the other six crimes relate to either domestic or public order type incidents.

Midgley

There were seven reported crimes in Midgley, none being of a serious and acquisitive nature. Two motorvehicle had been damaged at Denby Grange School and the rest of the recorded crimes were nothing of note.

Netherton

There four reported crimes in Netherton. Of these two were classed as a serious acquisitive crimes.

The first was an attempt theft from motor vehicle on Oakland Rd where a van was attacked but offenders disturbed. The second being a burglary on Netherton Lane where some tools were taken, no suspects identified. The other two crimes were domestic related.
