- Middlestown Junior School parking 3.20pm week days
- Speeding New Rd, Middlestown, Old Rd, Overton and Netherton Lane, Netherton.

Report

Patrols:

PC 1845 REPORTS - High visibility safe scheme patrols conducted throughout the Parish between 1500x1930hrs on 4/3/19. Netherton village Hall was closed & no children around, possibly due to inclement weather. Other rural areas included in patrols, including bridle paths & several footpaths which connect these remote areas - Spoke with occasional local residents who were walking dogs, all of whom were pleased to see officers - No issues reported.

PC 2639 Gallagher

Carried out safe scheme patrols between the hours of 15:00 and 19:00 6/3/19 including 1 hours agreed travelling time.

All areas of the Parish high visibility patrolled paying attention to the village hall, Emroyd common and surrounding areas.

Engaged with a resident on Coxley View who reported parking issues on the street which were resolved and an email sent to the NPT for future reference.

PC Steel reports,

Patrols made as part of safe scheme on 08.03.19 between 2200 x 0100.

Church hall patrolled with no issues. No signs of vehicles even using the area due to no rubbish etc. I then patrolled the general area conducting traffic stops. No issues with any vehicles. No mopeds seen in area and certainly no groups causing anti-social behaviour.

Pc6254 Varley reports:

Patrol in marked traffic car as part of Sitlington Safer scheme. 1100x1400hrs 12/03/2019.

Pro-Laser Speed checks conducted on New Road, Middlestown.

3 drivers advised for exceeding 30mph speed limit (31-35mph)

1 driver reported for driving at 37mph. Will be offered a speed awareness course.

1 vehicle stopped for no MOT. Enquiries concluded this was a clerical error.

1 driver reported for failing to comply with a red traffic light.

Approached by member of public who was reporting he had had a confrontation with the driver of Wakefield City Council refuse collection on Green Lane, Middlestown. He was alleging the driver had threatened him. Refuse lorry stopped and driver advised. No further action required.

Crime

Middlestown

There were eight reported crimes in Middlestown;

- On the 26th March a property on Sandy Lane was entered via an insecure window and jewellery was stolen within.
- On the 6th and 7th March, two vehicles were attacked on Ridge Crescent and Nell Gap Lane respectively resulting in damage locks and tools and electronics taken from within.

- On the 4th March a damage took place on Albion Mews but this was thought to be domestic related and on the 15th, damage took place on Emroyd Common where trees had been cut down and set alight.
- The other three crimes consisted of 1 threats, 1 harassment and 1 theft.

Midgley

There was one theft reported in Midgley for March.

Netherton

There were six reported crimes in Netherton;

- On the 9th and 10th March, properties on Netherton Lane and Coxley View were attacked respectively. Clearly committed by the same offender who used a blow torch to gain entry before making off with electrical items.
- On the 14th March, a brick was thrown through a window on Upper Lane, one male arrested but unfortunately there was not enough evidence to prosecute.
- The other three crimes relate to 2 assaults and 1 domestic controlling behaviour.

Overton

There were no reported crimes in Overton in March

New Hall Prison

There were ten reported offences from New Hall Prison. Six assaults and four drugs.
