Patrols:

PC 1845 Blore reports

Worked 18:00 x 20:00 in the Netherton area at the youth club after reports of ASB and drug taking around the youth club and park on Coxley view. I spent time with the staff at the youth club who stated that they were finding a large amount of silver gas canisters. I have left my details with the staff and asked that they keep one of the canisters for me and to obtain details of vehicles that are seen using the canisters in the area. The staff have passed me some details of a possible person who is providing the canisters and I will be liaising with the NPT for the area. No issues to report

Again I believe a number of traffic officers have worked the scheme and have performed various shifts doing speed checks in the problem areas but they have not updated me with what they have done. I have sent an email asking for updates but they are not on duty for the next few days.

<u>Crime</u>

Middlestown

There were twelve reported crimes in Middlestown;

- Damage to a vehicle on New Rd where a window to a high value Maseratti was smashed with a crow bar. No suspects identified despite being witnesses present.
- There were 5 domestic related crimes two assaults and two other assaults involving a child, all of these have resulted in charges against the offenders.
- Other incidents of note are a public order type incident involving a neighbour dispute and a robbery of a taxi driver.

Midgley

There were no reported crimes in Midgley.

Netherton

There four reported crimes in Netherton.

- There were two motor vehicles damaged by being scratched by unknown offenders, one on Highfield Rd and one on Coxley View.
- An attempt theft from motor vehicle took place on South Lane where an unknown offender tried to prise open a sliding door causing damage but no entry gained.

• The last crime relates to theft of number plates which took place on Coxley View. They were later used on another car to steal fuel from a petrol station in Wakefield.

Overton

There were six crimes reported in Overton.

- There have been three burglaries reported in the area, the first being at Overton Stores where an unknown offender forced a rear door and stole cash and cigarettes. The other two are burglaries to houses on Old Rd and Highfield Crescent. It is believed these have been committed by the same suspect as on both occasions, they have smashed a patio door to gain entry.
- Damage was caused to a property on Wood Lane where a plant pot was thrown through a window, this is thought to be domestic related.
- The other two crimes relate to a sexual assault on a female in the Reindeer Inn, the suspect was arrested and a nuisance calls type incident which was domestic related.

New Hall Prison

There were fourteen reported offences from New Hall Prison. One was a rape, two drugs related offences where visitors were caught smuggling in drugs for prisoners and 11 assaults, 8 where inmates have assaulted other inmates and 3 where a prison guard was assaulted.

Anti-Social Behaviour

There were only 4 reported ASB related incidents in the Sitlington Parish;

Middlestown

 Nuisance youths on Cross Rd where children in clown masks were making a nuisance of themselves scaring members of the public.

Netherton

• On Netherton Lane, a report was made about children entering a privately owned orchard and they were seen to throw apples around at each other.

Overton

 The cricket pavilion was subject to two calls for service due to youths being loud and starting fires.
